

TOP 10 JA BIZTOWN KNOWLEDGE CONCEPTS

JA BizTown helps students make the connection between what they learn in school and the real world. The Top Ten Knowledge Concepts can be used to understand the main vocabulary students need to master before their simulation visit. The main concepts are bolded and underlined for easier use. Each concept is covered by a specific lesson(s) available in your curriculum guide. This is <u>not</u> to be used as a curriculum overview.

UNIT 1: COMMUNITY & ECONOMY

- There is a <u>circular flow</u> of resources (human, capital and natural), goods, services and money flow between businesses and people within a free enterprise economy.
 - Lesson: Circular Flow of an Economy (Pg. 3-12)
- 2. <u>Free enterprise</u> is a system in which economic decisions are made in markets by people and businesses, with limited government influence.
 - Lesson: Free Enterprise (Pg. 21-27)
- 3. The <u>three basic economic questions</u> faced by an economy are: What to produce? How to produce it? For whom to produce?

- 4. Starting a business, with an intent to earn a profit is **entrepreneurship**
